

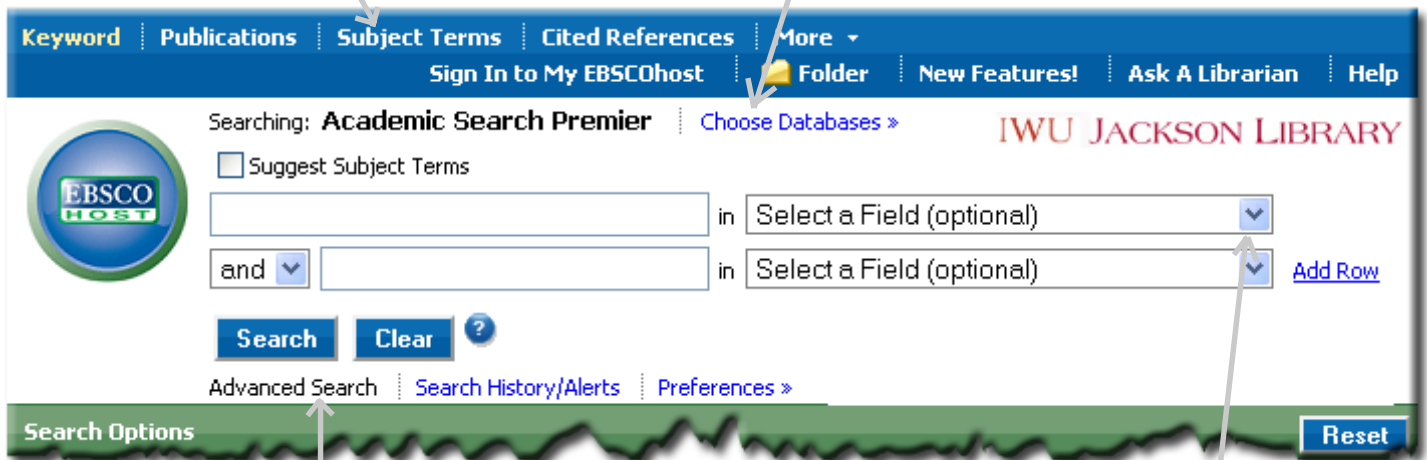
IWU Library EBSCO Database Guide



When you choose EBSCOhost you see nearly 30 databases including *Academic Search Premier*, *CINAHL*, *ERIC* and *ATLA*. Choosing multiple databases may limit search functionality.

For precise searching, try clicking on **Subject Terms** and enter your term after **Browse for:** then choose the most appropriate subject terms.

EBSCO always starts in **Advanced Search**. Check the Suggest Subject Terms to explore subjects. To change Databases, just click on **Choose Databases**.



Click **Advanced Search** to set search limiters such as Journal Name, Date Published, Journal or Document.

Click here to limit search terms to author, title, etc.

Poor Search Example

classroom in public schools that include special ed students.

Yields 0 results

Avoid common words and generic terms i.e; in, public, that.

Better Search Example

special education AND inclusion

Yields over 858 results

Search with the fewest, most specific words.

Words without AND linking them, are searched as a phrase.

Remember OR is more. If you want less, choose AND or NOT.

Truncation Search Example

special educat* AND inclusion

Yields over 927 results

Use a wildcard (?) for one letter or truncation (*) symbols for one or more letters. Use truncation for spelling variations (amorti?e) or multiple word endings such as (computer*).

Search Options


Click **Advanced Search** to set limits on the results such as Peer-Reviewed or Linked Full Text.


Click on the folder icon to add records to the print, email, or export list.


What to do when you find a citation without full text


Select **Check the Journal Title Search** to see if the Library provides access in some other format or database. With access to 31,000+ titles in over 100 databases, your article may be available in full text from another source. If items are not available, you can click on **Request this item through interlibrary loan** to request items from Interlibrary Loan.


Open an article or click on **Folder** to view the print, e-mail, and save options.




To Print press the  button. The next page will allow you to determine how many pages will be printed. Next, press the **Print** button again.



To save, press the  button. EBSCO will tell you how many items will be saved. Next, press the **Save** button again. Now click **FILE SAVE AS...** from the Internet web browser.



To e-mail, press the  button. EBSCO will tell you how many items will be e-mailed. Next, type in the e-mail address, subject, and comments and press **Send**

When printing PDFs, use the control bar for Acrobat, not the Internet browser.



Click here to print, rather than using the File, Print menu option.
